With your passion and generous support, we will see a world where everyone drinks clean water!



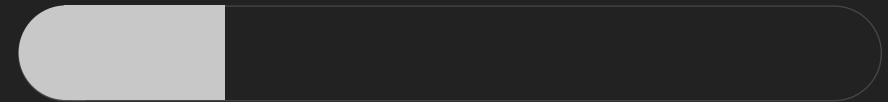

# *Burkina Faso*

**POPULATION:** 23.5 million

**CAPITAL:** Ouagadougou

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Mooré, Dioula, Fulfulde (all official),  
French, English

### THE NEED

In Burkina Faso, families face some of the harshest conditions on earth; it is currently ranked 186th out of 193 countries on the 2025 Human Development Index. Recurring droughts and political instability have left communities struggling to access basic needs, including clean water.

Funding water projects in Burkina Faso can transform everything for people in these challenging circumstances. Our local partners are building wells with hand pumps and piped systems across the country, bringing reliable water access where there was none and creating stability in an unstable environment.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Kenya

**POPULATION:** 52.4 million

**CAPITAL:** Nairobi

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Swahili, English (both official)

### THE NEED

In rural Kenya, 47% of people lack access to basic water services, and approximately one-third of the population lives below the poverty line. Seasonal water scarcity creates additional challenges for families already struggling to meet basic needs.

Funding work in Kenya helps implement water projects designed for the country's conditions. Our partners are constructing complex piped systems with wide distribution networks that can reach thousands of people – and the end result is clean water directly at individual taps in communities.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# *Madagascar*

**POPULATION:** 30.8 million

**CAPITAL:** Antananarivo

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Malagasy (official), French

### THE NEED

While Madagascar's remarkable biodiversity draws global conservation attention, the people who live there face severe challenges. In rural areas, only 36% have access to clean water. Regular floods, droughts, and cyclones make reliable access even more difficult.

Funding our work in Madagascar is creating lasting infrastructure that can withstand these challenges. Through piped water systems that bring clean water to community tap stands, household connections, and public water kiosks, our local partners are giving families reliable access to clean, safe water.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Malawi

**POPULATION:** 20.2 million

**CAPITAL:** Lilongwe

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** English, Chichewa (both official)

### THE NEED

In Malawi, 66% of the population lives below the income poverty line, and recent droughts and floods have devastated the country's underdeveloped water infrastructure. In rural areas, 31% of families still lack basic access to clean water.

Funding our work in Malawi is addressing issues of both water access and quality. Through comprehensive water, sanitation, and hygiene programming, our local partners are ensuring communities not only have clean water, but also the knowledge to maintain them long-term.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Mali

**POPULATION:** 22.4 million

**CAPITAL:** Bamako

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** French (official), Bambara

### THE NEED

Mali sits in the Sahel, one of the world's harshest environments, where prolonged dry seasons and very short rainy periods create severe water stress. Political instability compounds these challenges, affecting both individual and community health in the region.

Funding our work in Mali is providing reliable infrastructure designed for these extreme conditions. Through new wells with hand pumps and mechanized piped water systems, our local partners are bringing communities dependable access to clean water even during the longest dry seasons.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Niger

**POPULATION:** 26.4 million

**CAPITAL:** Niamey

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Hausa (official), French,  
and 10 other national languages

### THE NEED

Located in the Sahel, Niger faces extreme challenges: 50% of the population lives below the poverty line, and the region is prone to droughts, floods, and political instability. Despite having over three billion cubic meters of drinkable water underground, few communities can afford water infrastructure.

Funding our work in Niger is unlocking this hidden resource. Through context-adapted infrastructure, our local partner is tapping into underground water reserves to make them accessible to communities that have never had reliable clean water access.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Rwanda

**POPULATION:** 13.8 million

**CAPITAL:** Kigali

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Kinyarwanda, French, English,  
and Swahili

### THE NEED

Rwanda has made remarkable progress since the 1994 genocide, but challenges remain: more than 52% of the population still lives below the income poverty line, and in rural areas, many families lack reliable access to clean water and sanitation facilities.

Funding our work in Rwanda supports this ongoing recovery by bringing comprehensive water infrastructure to communities working to rebuild. Through large-scale piped systems designed for Rwanda's mountainous terrain, our local partners are providing reliable clean water access to those who need it most.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# *Sierra Leone*

**POPULATION:** 8.9 million

**CAPITAL:** Freetown

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** English, Krio

### THE NEED

Sierra Leone faces severe health challenges: 35% of the population lacks basic water access, 77% lacks basic sanitation, and the country has one of the world's highest under-5 mortality rates, as diarrheal diseases are a leading cause of death among young children.

Funding our work in Sierra Leone directly addresses these health crises by providing the infrastructure communities need to prevent waterborne disease. Through wells with hand pumps and sanitation facilities, our local partners are giving families the tools to protect their and their children's health.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Tanzania

**POPULATION:** 61.7 million

**CAPITAL:** Dodoma

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** Swahili, English

### THE NEED

In rural Tanzania, over half the population lacks access to basic water services, and the country's high infant mortality rate is directly linked to waterborne diseases. The underdevelopment of sustainable water, sanitation, and hygiene infrastructure means families face constant health risks.

Funding our work in Tanzania provides comprehensive infrastructure designed for long-term sustainability. No matter the type of water point our local partners implement, they're creating water access that communities can maintain and rely on for decades to come.

## COUNTRY OVERVIEW

# Uganda

**POPULATION:** 45.9 million

**CAPITAL:** Kampala

**PRIMARY LANGUAGES:** English, Swahili (both official),  
Luganda, various Bantu and Nilotic languages

## THE NEED

In rural Uganda, only 52% of families have access to clean water and just 18% to basic sanitation services. Specialized expertise and more expensive materials are required in Uganda, as low groundwater potential makes drilling challenging, and acidic conditions corrode standard iron pipes.

Funding our work in Uganda helps to overcome these technical challenges through properly engineered solutions. Our local partners use appropriate materials and construction techniques designed for Uganda's specific soil and water conditions, ensuring that infrastructure functions reliably no matter what.
