

## A closer look







POPULATION: 29.6 million CAPITAL: Antananarivo

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: Malagasy (official), French

#### THE NEED

While Madagascar's rich biodiversity draws environmental and conservation attention, the people who live there are often overlooked. The country ranks 177 out of 193 countries on the 2024 Human Development Index, and basic access to clean drinking water sits at just 53% throughout the country. In rural areas, that access drops to 36%. Sanitation and hygiene access is similarly limited. Regular floods, droughts, earthquakes, and cyclones exacerbate these basic health and safety concerns.

**COUNTRY OVERVIEW** 

### Malawi

POPULATION: 20.4 million

CAPITAL: Lilongwe

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: English, Chichewa (both official)

#### THE NEED

Malawi is one of Africa's most densely populated and least developed countries. According to 2019 World Bank data, 70.1% of the population lives below the global income poverty line of \$2.15 per day. They rank 172 out of 193 countries on the 2024 Human Development Index. Recent droughts and floods have destroyed already under-developed water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) infrastructure, and approximately 31% of the rural population continues to lack basic access to clean drinking water.

### Mali


POPULATION: 22.6 million

CAPITAL: Bamako

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: French (official), Bambara

#### THE NEED

For many families in Mali, the first step out of poverty begins with clean water. But in this landlocked country of vast deserts and long dry seasons, many lack essential access. At the same time, Mali is prone to droughts, floods, political instability and insecurity, and extremist violence. It ranks 188 out of 193 on the 2024 Human Development Index, and 20.8% of the population lives below the global income poverty line.

### Rwanda

POPULATION: 13.8 million


CAPITAL: Kigali

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: Kinyarwanda, French,

English, and Swahili



Rwanda is a landlocked country nestled in East Africa and known for its stunning landscapes. It ranks 161 out of 193 countries on the 2024 Human Development Index, with more than 52% of the population living below the global income poverty line. The country was significantly hurt by the Rwandan Civil War and 1994 genocide, but its developing economy has since continued to strengthen.


POPULATION: 8.6 million

CAPITAL: Freetown

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: English, Krio

#### THE NEED

Sierra Leone is ranked 184 out of 193 countries on the 2024 Human Development Index. Here, 46% of the rural population lacks access to basic water services and 86% lacks access to basic sanitation. At 10.1%, the country also has one of the highest under-5 mortality rates in the world. Diarrheal diseases are one of the leading causes of death, and access to clean water and sanitation could dramatically improve this tragic statistic.

POPULATION: 65 million

CAPITAL: Dodoma

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: Swahili, English

#### THE NEED

In rural Tanzania, where approximately 63% of the population resides, over 20 million people lack access to basic water services. The country has an under-5 mortality rate of 4.1%, which can largely be attributed to waterborne diseases such as cholera and diarrhea. These diseases stem from a lack of high-quality and sustainable water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) infrastructure. Overall, Tanzania is ranked 167 out of 193 countries on the 2024 Human Development Index.

## Uganda

POPULATION: 47.3 million

CAPITAL: Kampala

PRIMARY LANGUAGES: English, Swahili (both official),

Luganda, various Bantu and Nilotic languages

#### THE NEED

Nearly half of Uganda's rural population lacks basic access to clean water and 82% lack access to basic sanitation services. This is due to a variety of factors. Low groundwater potential has complicated drilling, while an increase in heavy rainy seasons has made construction more difficult in recent years. While safe to drink, Uganda's acidic groundwater has also caused corrosion and serious damage to galvanized iron pipes — the most common material used in old water points.

#### THE NEED

Years of recurring droughts, economic crises, and political turmoil have made access to water and sanitation a serious challenge in Zimbabwe. In rural areas, 52% of the population lacks access to basic water services and 68% lack access to basic sanitation. Zimbabwe ranks 159 out of 193 on the 2024 Human Development Index, and 39.8% of its population lives below the global income poverty line.








